Plymouth City stands on the border between Devon and Cornwall with arguably the finest waterfront location in the country. The sparkling seas of Plymouth Sound create a vast natural harbour, home to Britain's rich maritime heritage and now the playground of local yachtsmen and sailors. The city has much to offer beyond the working day and provides an exciting range of options for free time. It has broad pedestrianised streets and a new £200m state of the art shopping centre. Plymouth Pavilions and the Theatre Royal provide an unrivalled and complementary mix of arts, entertainment, drama and top touring rock & pop acts. There is a vibrant nightlife scene around the historic Barbican quarter which straddles the ancient harbour, and of course there are numerous local restaurants, bistros, bars and gastro pubs where fresh local produce are the order of the day. There is a modern Vue cinema complex, the world renowned National Marine Aquarium, and of course, Plymouth Hoe where you can simply relax and unwind after a busy day enjoying the breathtaking views. Or, you can visit the vast wilderness of Dartmoor with its challenging craggy tors, wooded valleys and wandering moorland paths.

Plymouth has good transport links with an Intercity station, domestic airport, and good local trunk roads linking into Cornwall and connecting with the M5 at Exeter.
